MUNICIPALITY OF JOINVILLE - BRIEF HISTORY



Joinville is a municipality located in the North Region of the state of Santa Catarina. Its population, according to data from the 2022 IBGE Census, was 616,317 inhabitants, being the largest city in the state, ahead of the capital Florianópolis, and it is the third most populous city in the South region of Brazil, behind only Porto Alegre and Curitiba (from which it is only 130 km away, thus, closer to the capital of Paraná than to the state itself). It has an area of 1,127.946 km². It belongs to the Microregion of Joinville and the Mesoregion of Northern Santa Catarina, and is the headquarters of the Metropolitan Region of Joinville.

The city has a high human development index (0.809) among Brazilian municipalities, ranking 21st nationally. A study named Joinville the second best city to live in Brazil. Joinville holds the titles of "Manchester of Santa Catarina", "City of Flowers", "City of Princes", and "City of Dance". It is also known for hosting the Joinville Dance Festival (considered the largest dance festival in the world), the Bolshoi Theater School in Brazil (the only one in the world outside of Russia) and the Joinville Esporte Clube.



The first name of Joinville was Colônia Dona Francisca, whose history began when Princess Francisca de Bragança, sister of D. Pedro II, married the French prince Francisco Fernando de Orléans in 1843, receiving the title of Prince of Joinville. The name of the city was changed to Joinville, to honor the prince, who received those lands as a dowry. In 1848, the couple negotiated the lands, at least in part, with the Hamburg Colonization Society, because Francisco's father, King Louis Philippe of France, had been dethroned and the family was in financial difficulties.¹






RULES AND REGULATIONS



The competition will follow the IOF orienteering rules, the CBO pedestrian orienteering rules (ROP/CBO) and the CAMBOR regulations, all available on the CBO website (www.cbo.org.br/regras)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION



- For safety reasons, it is recommended that elderly people, people with mobility difficulties and deaf people carry a whistle with them during their course, to be used in case of emergencies. The acquisition of this equipment is the responsibility of the athletes. (Rule 3.4.4 - ROP 2025)
- The athlete, when registering for an Orienteering event, authorizes the use of his/her images for the purposes of publicizing and promoting the sport, in accordance with rule 6.14 of ROP 2025;
- When registering to participate in an orienteering event, athletes or their legal guardians must DECLARE that they are responsible for any risks, physical or physiological problems that they may suffer during travel, the assembly area, and the execution of the courses, exempting those responsible for the areas, promoters, and organizers of the event from any liability arising from accidents or incidents that may occur before, during, and/or after the event competitions. They also CERTIFY that they are in perfect physical and medical condition to compete regularly in the event. Personal accident insurance is the responsibility of the athlete or club/entity to which he/she is affiliated. (Rule 6.6 - ROP 2025).

EMBARGOED AREAS



The entire geographic area of São Miguel and Laranjeiras, in Campo Alegre - SC (crossing through Estrada Saltinho is permitted). All the facilities of Recreativa da Tupy and Sociesc, in Joinville - SC. In the latter, participants are allowed to enter the area without an orientation map and without entering the buildings, until the day before the competition. On the day of the race, access will be limited by markers from the entrance to the starting area. The embargo extends to anyone who, due to their knowledge of the terrain or events, could influence the results of CamBOR 2026.
