INVITATION



The **Brazilian Orienteering Confederation (CBO)**, the **Santa Catarina Orienteering Federation (FCO)**, and the **Joinville Orienteering Club (COVILLE)** are pleased to extend an invitation to the "orienteering family" to partake in the **XXVII Brazilian Orienteering Championship**. This event will take place in Joinville and Campo Alegre, SC, **from April 30 to May 3, 2026**, and will be recognized as a valid event for the **IOF World Ranking Event (WRE)** of the **International Orienteering Federation (IOF)**.



The **Brazilian Orienteering Championship (CamBOr)** will consist of three distinct events occurring concurrently, as outlined below:

a. CamBOr Sub 20

The Brazilian Under-20 Orienteering Championship will be held in the following categories: Children, Youth (qualifying for the Brazilian Student Championship), and Junior (qualifying for the Brazilian University Championship).

b. CamBOr 21

The 21st Brazilian Orienteering Championship will be accessible to athletes of **any ages**, without any limitations.

For athletes in the HD21E categories who are enrolled in educational institutions and are up to 25 years of age, the competition will also contribute to the Brazilian University Championship.

c. CamBor Master (35+)

The Brazilian Master Orienteering Championship will feature competitors across all categories aged 35 and above (HD 35, 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65, 70, 75, 80, 85, 90, ...).



TOURIST ATTRACTIONS IN CAMPO ALEGRE



Paradise Waterfall: This waterfall is situated in the heart of the city, just a few meters from City Hall. With a combined height exceeding 60 meters, its two cascades are framed by rock walls that are perfect for rappelling and climbing. The location is ideal for swimming and appreciating the picturesque surroundings. Near the summit of the waterfall, a natural viewpoint offers panoramic views of the entire city and the Serra Dona Francisca mountains. <https://maps.app.goo.gl/HLiWsr2VADJfDdsA9>



Blue House: The Blue House is a private residence, not accessible to the public. Nevertheless, its architectural elegance and the breathtaking scenery in which it is situated, surrounded by araucaria trees, have rendered it a point of interest for tourists.



Salto do Engenho: This waterfall, standing at a height of 7 meters, boasts a substantial volume of water. As the waterfall traverses the road, the water on the opposite side is calmer and shallower. Take pleasure in the recreational area, which features benches ideal for picnicking with family and friends.

Bugio Ramp: Comprises two verdant ramps situated atop a mountain at an elevation of 1,100 meters, featuring a 230-meter descent. The upper ramp provides a panoramic 360-degree view, allowing visibility of Bateias de Baixo and the center of Campo Alegre in the distance. The lower ramp is positioned slightly below and includes an infinity swing, along with several benches and tables.

Campo Alegre City Hall and Eugênio Tabbert Square: The striking green edifice of Campo Alegre City Hall is a historic structure featuring exquisite architecture; it formerly served as the local public jail and now accommodates the executive branch's headquarters. In front of the city hall lies the picturesque Eugênio Tabbert Square, framed by trees and gardens, with a notable fountain adorned with vibrant fish.

Rural Tour in Campo Alegre: This guided motorized excursion allows visitors to explore various rural properties that offer organic products, including strawberries, cheeses, biscuits, and handicrafts.

Cascatinha Boardwalk: The Cascatinha Boardwalk is a public recreational area situated adjacent to a picturesque waterfall created by the Farias Stream. The black and white stones of the boardwalk are arranged to depict various images that symbolize the municipality, including the Araucaria tree and the pine nut.

Quiriri Fields: The Quiriri Fields are characterized by an extensive mountain range that includes the cities of Campo Alegre, Joinville, and Garuva in northern Santa Catarina, as well as Tijucas do Sul in Paraná. The range boasts over 30 peaks. The primary access point is via Campo Alegre, located 56 km from the city center. The final kilometers of the road are only navigable by 4x4 vehicles. The round-trip hike to Pedra da Tartaruga (Turtle Rock) spans approximately 28 km, with the most frequented camping area typically situated near this rock formation. Access is restricted; prior permission and an entrance fee are required. Guided tours are highly recommended.

Discounts from the Federal Government's CadÚnico program will only be available to athletes registered with the CBO, as per ROP 2025.

7.3 Athletes who are elementary, middle, and high school students, affiliated with the CBO (Confederação Brasileira de Orientação), and who qualified in the previous year's competitions and are registered in the Federal Government's CadÚnico program will receive a 50% discount on registration fees.

Also, according to ROP 2025:

28.2.1 The Brazilian Orienteering Championship will be contested in the following difficulty levels: Elite - E, Very Difficult - A, and Difficult - B.

28.2.2 To minimize the exclusion of N categories, it is up to the organizer to offer open courses (Long Open, Short Open, etc.) to allow the participation of beginner athletes, WITHOUT A COMPETITIVE CHARACTER.

Therefore, registration will only be possible for beginner athletes in the Open categories, available on the registration form. It should also be noted that the forest courses will have **3 types of open courses**:

Open Short (easy difficulty and short distance), **Open Medium** (easy difficulty and medium distance), and **Open Long** (medium difficulty and long distance).

In the **Sprint** course there will **only be one Open category**.

With the aim of welcoming newcomers and keeping the orienteering family united at the 27th CamBOR, this Club is taking the initiative to create these "OPEN" categories and offer a single, more affordable price until the deadline.



INFORMATION REGARDING THE UTILIZATION OF MAPS

FOREST, SPRINT AND TRAIL-O

The map scales and contour line equidistances will adhere to the guidelines set forth by the current ROP/CBO (Foot Orienteering Rules/Brazilian Orienteering Confederation).

ATHLETE GEAR



The Organizing Committee is assembling a kit to be distributed to all athletes registered for CamBOR 2026.

MAPS



The maps were developed in compliance with the international standards for orienteering maps (ISOM 2017-2) and the international standards for sprint orienteering maps (ISSprOM 2019-2).

Map of Forest: Unpublished, in progress.

Trai-O Map: Currently being updated.

Sprint Map: Currently unpublished and under review.

FOREST COURSES:

Middle and long courses are distinguished by diverse terrain and vegetation, encompassing open fields, Araucaria forests, and indigenous flora, including gallery forests in the lower regions. The landscape is notably hilly, which we regard as nearly ideal for orienteering.

MODEL EVENT:

Adjacent to the Floresta arena vicinity.

SPRINT:

The Sprint Course will be conducted in a recreational area featuring numerous buildings, corridors, staircases, and the potential for multiple levels.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

AIRPORTS:



The primary commercial airports are:

- (JOI) – Joinville Airport, located 60 kilometers from Arena Floresta.
- (CWB) – Curitiba International Airport (90 km from Arena Floresta);
- (NVT) – Navegantes International Airport, located 150 km from Arena Floresta.

RULES:



The competition will adhere to the IOF Rules for Foot Orienteering Competitions, the CBO Foot Orienteering Rules, and the CamBOR Regulations, all of which will be in effect at the time of the event and can be accessed at: <https://www.cbo.org.br/arquivo?caminho=CBO/01-CBO/Regras>

In accordance with rule 6.6 of the ROP, competitors engaged in an event assume responsibility for any risks and accidents they may encounter during travel, assembly, and the execution of the courses. Accident insurance is the obligation of the athlete or the club to which they are affiliated.

For safety purposes, it is advisable for elderly individuals, those with mobility challenges, and individuals who are deaf to carry a whistle during their travels, to be utilized in emergencies.

Athletes participating in the event grant permission for the use of their images to publicize and promote the sport.

Athletes who are under 18 years of age must obtain permission from a guardian to participate in official events.




CLASSES:

EXTREME HEAT CONDITIONS:



The Brazilian Orienteering Confederation (CBO) informs that, starting in 2026, all national and regional events will follow, on an experimental basis, the **Guidelines for Competitions in Extreme Heat**, aligned with the International Orienteering Federation (IOF) and the ROP CBO 2026. The objective is to increase the safety of participants and standardize actions in high-temperature situations.

The Referee and the General Director will monitor **the WBGT (Wet Bulb Globe Temperature) index** — **an advanced measure of thermal stress that combines temperature, humidity, wind, and solar radiation**. The value of this index will be announced by the Safety Manager before the race on posters in the warm-up area and at the starting points.

WBGT reference ranges:

Below 28°C: safe conditions

28°C–30°C: Pay attention to vulnerable groups.

30°C–32°C: Mitigation assessment.

Above 32°C: Test may be postponed or cancelled.

Safety is a shared responsibility between the organization, teams, and athletes. Each participant must know their limits, stay hydrated, and watch for signs of heat exhaustion.

The CBO reinforces its commitment to the well-being of athletes and to international best practices. Further information can be found in ROP 2026/Appendix 5 - Risk management and safety in competitions.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION



EQUIPMENT (GPS), IOF Rules 2026:

“21.4 Competitors must not use or carry communication devices that can transmit or receive information, to or from a remote source, between entering the quarantine zone (or the start area if there is no quarantine zone) and reaching the finish in a race, unless the equipment is approved by the organiser. GPS-enabled devices (watches etc.) can be carried provided that they are not used for communication or navigation. However, the organiser has the right to specifically forbid the use of such equipment. The organiser may require competitors to carry a tracking device and/or a GPS data logger.”
