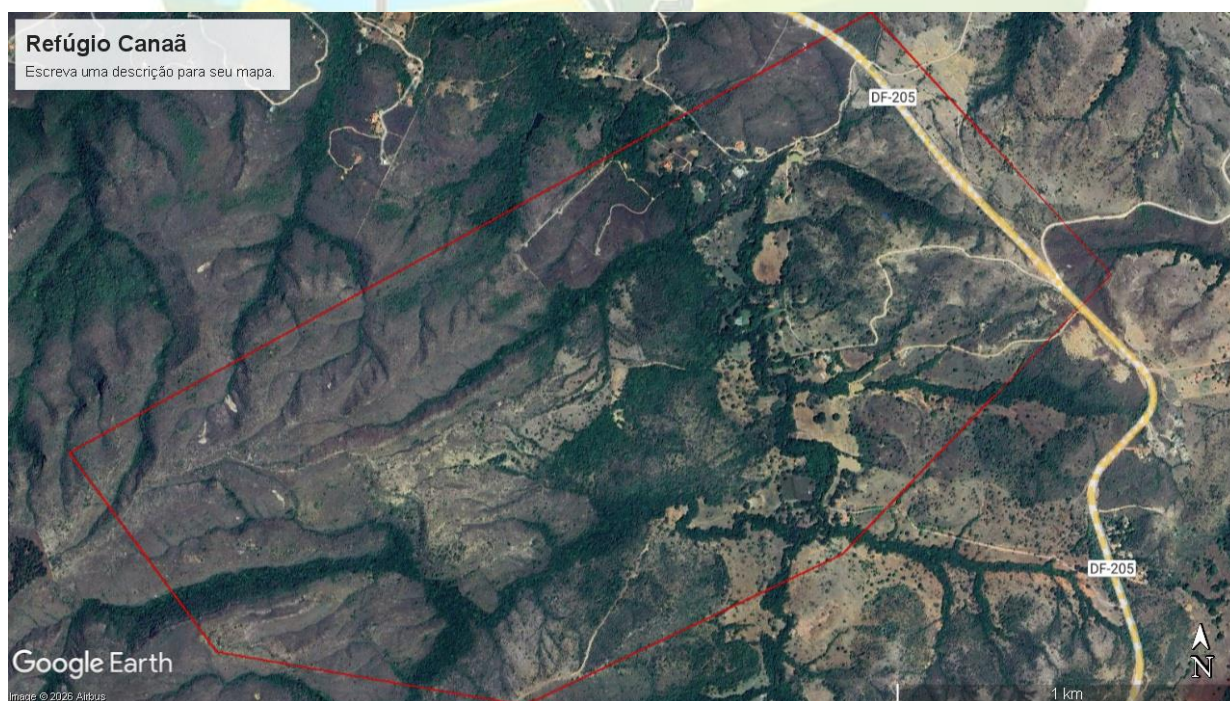
As a general rule, before the TCO 2026 races competitors are not permitted to enter the competition areas shown on the maps below.

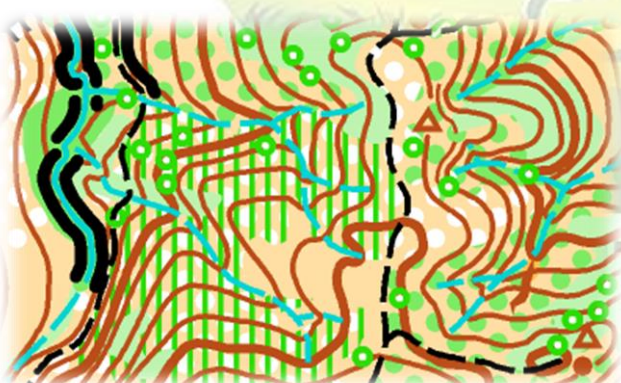

The maps produced for the XIII TCO (Gold WRE) are new, created between January and August 2026 in accordance with ISOM 2017-2 (Revision 6) and ISSprOM 2019-2, and have the following characteristics

1. FOREST TERRAIN

a. Scales: 1) Middle: <u>1:7.500.</u> 2) Long: <u>1:10.000.</u> Note: The scales above, previously approved by the IOF Adviser, were adopted to improve map readability, particularly in relation to terrain relief. b. Contour interval: 5 meters.	



a. Forest competition areas

1) Terrain:

- a) In both competition areas, the terrain is highly varied and undulating, with elevations ranging from 855 m to 1,005 m. The areas are characterized by a high frequency of ravines and thalwegs, both shallow and deep, which will impose significant physical and technical demands on competitors.
- b) Much of the terrain is covered with loose rock fragments, commonly referred to as scree or gravel, which may compromise footing and traction, particularly in the more rugged sections of the competition areas.



- 2) Vegetation: in both competition areas, the vegetation consists predominantly of open and semi-open terrain (401–404), interspersed with patches of low-growing vegetation (407 and 409), which may include thorny plants, and shrubby Cerrado vegetation (406 and 408). These areas are complemented by riparian and gallery forests (405, 406, 408, and 410), creating a diverse vegetation pattern with varying degrees of runnability and visibility.





3) Hydrography:

a) In the central section of the course, two streams converge in the northern part of the map. They are fordable (*) along almost their entire length. Competitors should pay particular attention to sharp bends in the streams, where the channels are deeper due to erosion, as well as to the presence of impassable cliffs along the banks, all of which have been mapped.

b) All watercourse banks have been mapped, with particular attention given to sections featuring steep banks and cliffs, both passable and impassable.

c) Several seasonal watercourses occur throughout the two competition areas, ranging from shallow to deep channels. These features have been represented using ISOM 2017-2 symbol 306.



4) **Roads, paths and man-made features**

a) The properties hosting the forest courses contain various trails and unpaved roads, all of which are free of vehicular traffic.

b) As the Long course is located within an ecovillage, there are private areas that must not be entered. These areas have been clearly identified on the map and must be respected by all competitors.

c) Sections of barbed-wire fencing were observed, particularly in steeper terrain and in the vicinity of watercourses and springs. All fences encountered have been mapped. Nevertheless, competitors must exercise extra caution when crossing or moving near fenced areas, especially on steep slopes and around watercourses.



5) **Additional information**

Ticks may be present due to the presence of wild animals in the area. Dry conditions and the absence of rainfall may favor their occurrence. However, only minimal tick activity was observed during the mapping period.

2. **SPRINT COURSE**

a. **Samples and information about the maps**

1) **Scale:** 1:3.000

2) **Contour interval:** 2 meters



b. **Sprint competition area**

1) The Sprint course will take place within a fully fenced private area characterized by predominantly flat terrain.

2) The vegetation consists of wooded areas (405, 406, and 408) and open areas (401 and 402), allowing free running across almost the entire competition area.

3) Due to the architectural characteristics of the capital, the area contains structures with varied and complex forms, including numerous elevated and underground multi-level walkways. Competitors should pay particular attention to these features when interpreting the map and planning their routes.

4) All staircases will be represented with a brown background, regardless of whether they are covered or open to the sky. This convention has been adopted to improve map readability and facilitate the identification of stairways during the competition.
